NOTICE

THAT IN AN EGALITARIAN BRIGHTON IT WOULD BE THE LAW THAT

Squatting Would Be Legal

Any reasonable* number of persons in good standing** who do not otherwise have a safe place to live could live together **for free** in any house or apartment that is safe and not already reasonably used by others as their primary place of residence.

Residential buildings would be used for shelter, not rental income.

Houses and apartments would belong to those who reasonably use them as their primary place of residence, for as long as they do so.

All people in good standing** would have no need for rental income or any other money because they would have an equal right to freely take products from the economy (housing, food, clothing, services, etc.) according to need and reasonable desire, or to receive scarce products equitably rationed according to need.

* What is reasonable is determined by the local Assembly of Egalitarians***

** All persons are in good standing unless the Assembly determines that, after taking into account the particular circumstances and reasonableness, they are violating the principle of “from each according to ability, to each according to need.”

*** The Assembly meets the 2nd Wednesday of each month, 7:00-8:00 PM at the PSF Community Center, 640 Washington St. (Oak Sq.), Brighton. An egalitarian is any person who supports:

- **Equality** (in the sense of “no rich and no poor,” not “equal opportunity” to get richer than others) and
- **Mutual Aid** (or **Solidarity**, meaning helping each other, not being pitted against others in competition by an oppressor to control us)

Mission: All egalitarians (and only egalitarians) of Brighton are invited to the Assembly to discuss how to promote public understanding of what egalitarianism is, why it's much better than the *status quo*, and how to build the egalitarian revolutionary movement. In an egalitarian society the Local Assembly of Brighton Egalitarians would be the **ONLY** body that makes laws people in Brighton would have to obey. One thing we do is write and post examples of such laws so people can see how much better egalitarianism is.
